

Welcome to the McGrath Institute for Church Life


The McGrath Institute for Church Life is an academic department within the University of Notre Dame that serves the wider Catholic Church through the development of faithful Catholic leaders.

Echo students benefit from a robust formation curriculum that integrates their work, study, and life of faith, in order to serve the Church and explore a vocation in ministry.

CYM sessions combine theological exploration and personal renewal to invigorate participants' ministry to young people.

With the rich insights of nationally-known speakers and the mentorship of college students, Notre Dame Vision gives high school students the experience of reflecting on their own story, Jesus' story, and how God is calling them to be Christ for others.

Science & Religion Initiative

To meet this need, the Science & Religion Initiative equips educators to effectively communicate the complementarity of faith and reason across the scientific disciplines and beyond.

The Fiat Program assists dioceses, parishes, and communities in fostering a culture of communion where everyone can experience the grace of Christian friendship and the sacramental life.

Embracing the diverse spiritual needs and complex realities of multi-generational Hispanic communities in the United States, these training sessions offer new methods to overcome existing challenges in passing on the Catholic faith between immigrant parents and first- and second-generation Hispanics born in the United States.

Eucharistic Culture Project

Building Eucharistic Cultures and Forming Leaders

The Eucharistic Culture Project is an initiative of the Notre Dame Center for Liturgy that addresses major pastoral issues of the Church by forming and educating a cohort of leaders from parishes, dioceses, schools, and apostolates. We believe that we can create a culture infused with Christ's self-giving love by grounding the Church's preaching, teaching, prayer, and service in the Eucharistic mystery.

Contours of Wonder

Childhood and the Liturgical Imagination

Contours of Wonder is a three-year research and pastoral initiative of the Notre Dame Center for Liturgy that seeks to promote the liturgical participation of the young child in the Church today. We believe that by attending to the liturgical formation of the young child, we can renew liturgical formation for all Catholics in a technocratic age.

Savoring the Mystery

Catholic Preaching in an Age of Disaffiliation

Savoring the Mystery is a three-year initiative of the Notre Dame Center for Liturgy that helps Catholic clergy to better preach the mystery of Jesus Christ in Scripture, and the lay faithful to proclaim that mystery in the world. We believe that we can revitalize Catholic preaching, both liturgical and non-liturgical, by fostering a love of Scripture and of the Church's homiletic traditions.

Strong Foundations supports young lay leaders to enhance their service to the Church through professional and pastoral development, financial and career planning, personal support, networking, and the ongoing accompaniment of a mentor-minister.

Young Adult Innovation Hub

Empowering Young Hispanic Leaders

A partnership with Chicago-based Iskali, an organization that empowers and equips young Hispanics with high-quality faith formation, this program creates cultures of affiliation at the parish level, addressing the particular needs of first-, second-, and third-generation Hispanics in the United States.

Catechist Academy

Young Adults Handing on the Faith to Future Generations

The Catechist Academy places Notre Dame, Saint Mary's and Holy Cross students in parishes across the South Bend/Mishawaka community. Participants spend time each week as catechists leading students from preschool to confirmation age into a deeper understanding of, and relationship with, Jesus Christ.

Take a Second Look

Addressing Disaffiliation with Notre Dame Students

Developed for undergraduate students, this program persuasively encourages students to "take a second look" at the beauty and profundity of the Catholic faith that they thought they had left behind, outgrown, or had never considered. The goal is to accompany them through this time of sincere questioning and growth to a deeper understanding that will help them live out their faith over a lifetime.
